Following the success of Operation Return, launched last year in Amsterdam, Crimestoppers released details of six further UK criminals suspected of being on the run in the Netherlands.



Operation Return II is a multi-agency campaign involving the Serious Organised Crime Agency (SOCA), Crimestoppers UK, Meld Misdaad Anoniem/'M' (Dutch Crimestoppers) and Netherlands law enforcement. It aims to engage the media and the public to help locate fugitives wanted for serious crimes committed in the UK but believed to be in and around the city of Amsterdam.
